

Combining School and Qualifications

The Maritime Academy is hosted in a purpose built facility on College grounds.

Students undertaking the Maritime Industry Pathway are able to integrate their compulsory learning with their VET qualifications, enabling them to complete their NTCET, and in some cases, achieve an ATAR. All students will have an Education and Training Plan developed for them to ensure all individual learning needs and desired outcomes upon exiting the program are met.



The Maritime Academy aims to broaden and support opportunities for senior school students to complete their NT Certificate of Education and Training (NTCET) and explore maritime industry pathways leading to further education or work.



Special Requirements and Prerequisites for Certificate I and II in Maritime Operations

- students must be at least 16 years of age
- participants must pass appropriate colour blindness testing

Year Ten students involved in the Maritime Academy will study:

- Stage One Integrated Learning
- Recreational Boating Course
- First Aid
- Elements Slipboard Safety
- Basic Marine Navigation



What is the Maritime Industry Pathway?

The Maritime Pathway is an entry level course that provides students with maritime skills and knowledge to enable them to be immediately employable as Deck Hands.

This qualification assists students to fast track their maritime careers as deck officers, marine engineers, or work in maritime tourism and/or business. The units of competency completed during this course gain credit toward a Coxswain qualification. This can be completed when students reach the age of 16 and have spent sufficient time at sea, or completed an approved task book on 30 days commercial sea time.

Years Eleven & Twelve

In the CSC Maritime Academy students in Years Eleven and Twelve may undertake the following qualifications:

- Certificate I Maritime Operations (Coxswain Grade 2 Near Coastal)
- Certificate II Maritime Operations (Coxswain Grade 1 Near Coastal)
- Certificate III Fishing Operations

Course Delivery

- Certificate II in Maritime Operations will be delivered in a combination of day and block training.
- Training will be at Casuarina Senior College on either a Monday or Tuesday
- Induction week in Week Two Term One
- One week blocks for practical training and assessment in Semesters One & Two
- Structured work placement organised by Industry Engagement Officers

VET Competencies

- Perform basic servicing and maintenance of main propulsion unit and auxiliary systems (MARB002)
- Operate inboard and outboard motors (MARC005)
- Operate main propulsion unit and auxiliary systems (MARC006)
- Apply basic survival skills in the event of vessel abandonment (MARF001)
- Follow procedures to minimise and fight fires on board a vessel (MARF002)
- Meet work health and safety requirements (MARF004)
- Survive at sea using survival craft (MARF005)
- Plan and navigate a passage for a vessel up to twelve metres (MARH001)
- Comply with regulations to ensure safe operation of vessels up to twelve metres (MATI001)
- Follow environmental work practices (MARJ001)
- Handle a vessel up to twelve metres (MARK001)
- Apply seamanship skills aboard a vessel up to twelve metres (MARN002)
